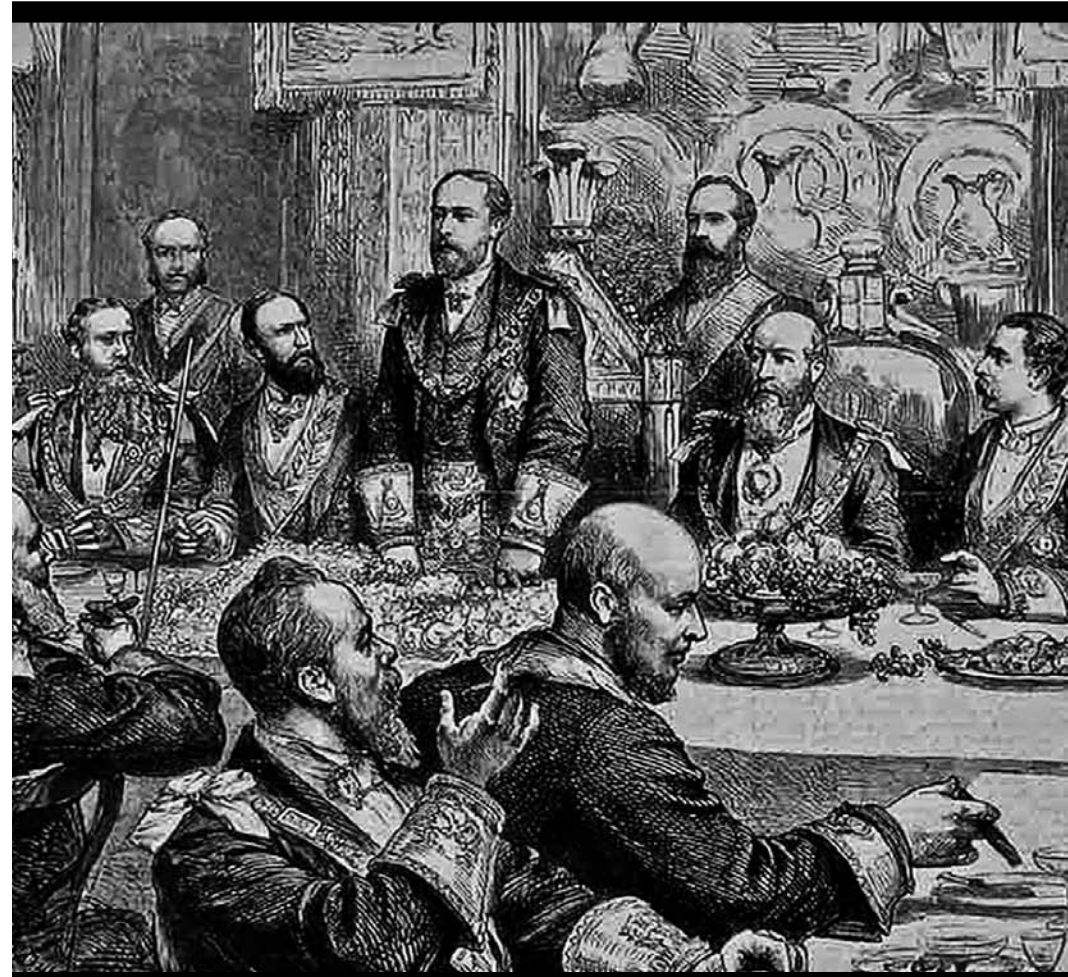

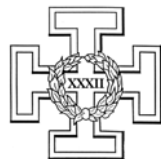

It was formed August 5, 1813, in New York, by Sovereign Grand Inspector General of the Southern Jurisdiction and its then Grand treasurer General, Ill.: Emanuel De La Motta, 33°, to govern itself and regulate all degrees of the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite within the Jurisdiction and to perpetuate the ritual and philosophy of the Rite in substantial accordance with the ancient landmarks of the Rite.

The Supreme Council of the Northern Jurisdiction is limited to sixty-six Active Thirty-Third Degree Masons, excluding the Emeritus and Past active members. The states under the Jurisdiction of the Northern Supreme Council are: Connecticut, Delaware, Illinois, Indiana, Maine, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Islands, Vermont and Wisconsin.
