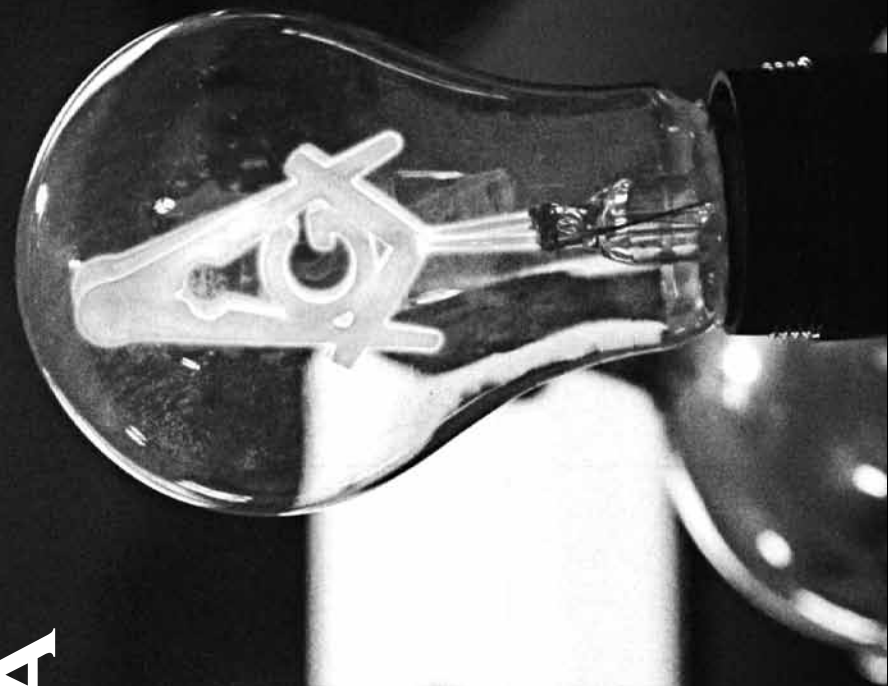

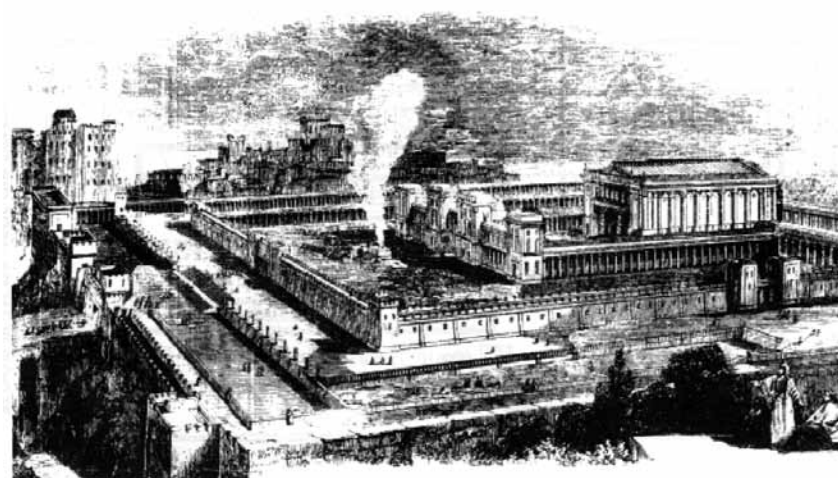

Under his command and responsibilities, Dale has lead 46 SWAT Operations involving high arrests and search warrant missions, and missions that range from dignitary protection to response involving weapons of mass destruction.

To lead and mobilize this effort, Dale draws on his extensive background of investigative, tactical and leadership experiences. His eight years as U. S. Marine Officer and over 25 years of service with the FBI in 9 separate offices throughout the Country has prepared him well to perform his SWAT Commander responsibilities for one of only 9 Enhanced FBI SWAT Teams in the Nation.

During his 25 years in FBI, Dale has been a Tactical Assaulter/ Sniper on the Nation's only Federal Law Enforcement Counter-Terrorist Team, the FBI's Hostage Rescue Team (HRT), at Quantico, VA as well as serving as a SWAT Tactical Assaulter/Sniper on numerous other FBI

SWAT Teams. This, coupled with Dale's investigative background experiences has resulted in his involvement in a variety of high profile and significant events, both domestic and foreign.

Dale holds a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Arizona in Criminal Justice and is a graduate of Naval Flight School, Pensacola, FL and the Naval Legal Justice School, Colorado, CA.
