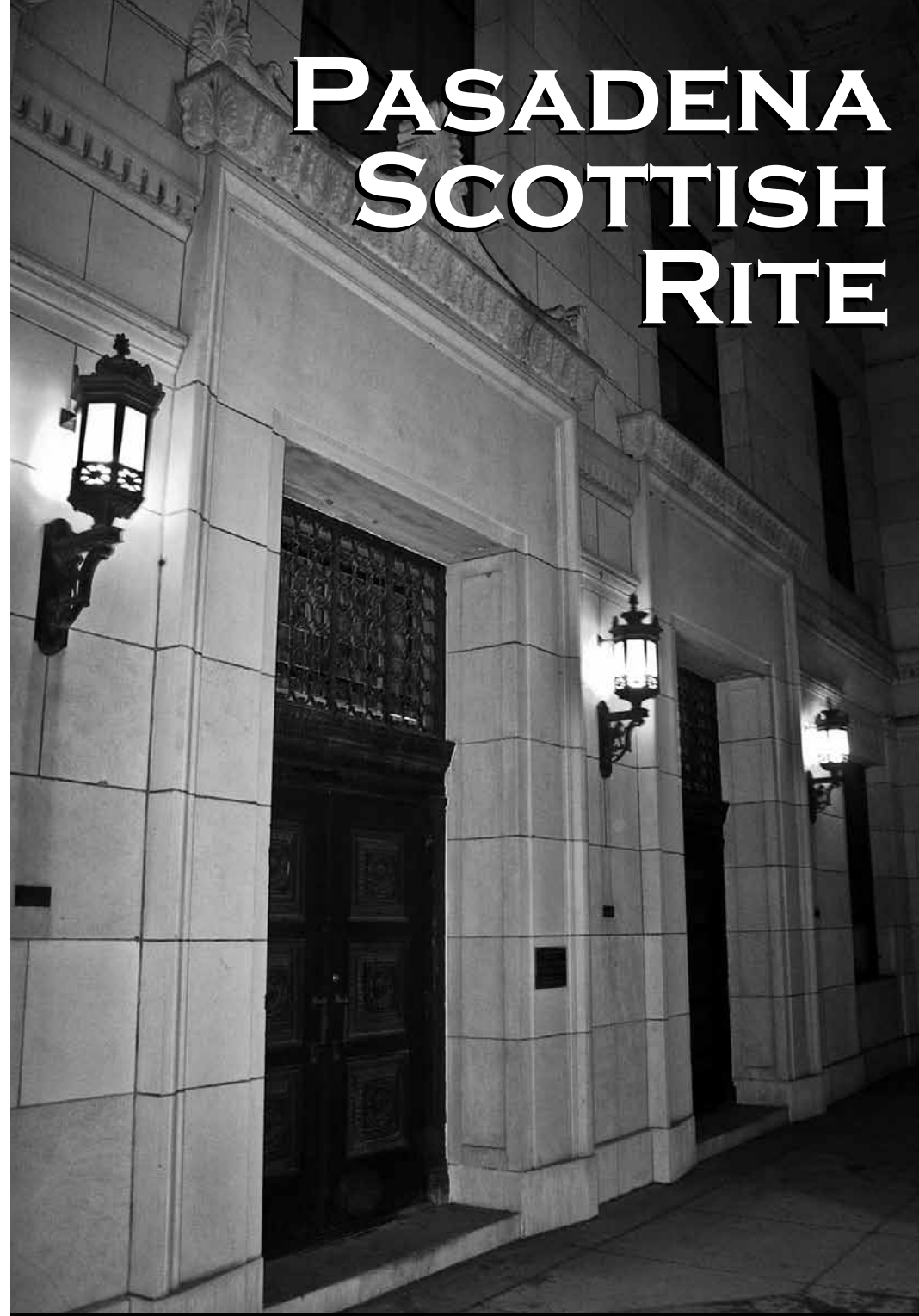

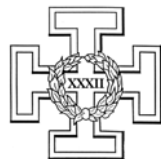

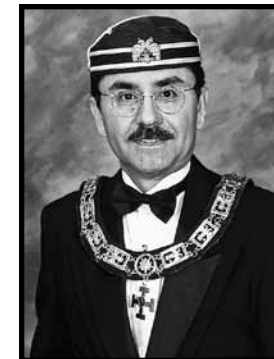

Quatuor Coronati Lodge

This Lodge No. 2076 on the roll of the Grand Lodge of England, was established in 1886. The Transactions of the Lodge are published under the title *Ars Quatuor Coronatorum*. The Lodge is named after the Four Crowned Martyrs.

Attached to the Lodge, which is limited to forty members, is a Correspondence Circle, established in 1887, numbering several thousand members from all parts of the world. Master Masons are eligible to membership in the Correspondence Circle. The Transactions of the Lodge are sent to each member.

Its purpose: Studying history, symbols and legends of Freemasonry. It is in fact a Masonic literary and archeological society meeting as a tiled Lodge.

Several members of the Pasadena Scottish Rite are members of this Lodge.

Here at the Language Center we educate children and their families everyday because communicating effectively impacts the learning, socialization, and emotional development of the children we serve. This month at the Language Center we evaluated one child, discharged two children, and completed 200.5 hours of therapy for the 42 kids on our caseload. On Saturday, June 4th the Pasadena Scottish Rite will proudly host two of the true giants of Scottish Rite Masonry - Illustrious Brothers Robert Davis, 33^o G.C. and Dr. James Tresner, 33^o G.C. in an open discussion of writing about and researching Freemasonry. They will share their insight and experiences both writing for and editing Masonic publications.

Ill. Brother Davis is a professional writer and has written and spoken to many diverse organizations about the role of masculine initiation in society and how it relates to Freemasonry in particular. He is currently editor of three prestigious Masonic publications, serves as administrator for the Guthrie Oklahoma Scottish Rite Bodies and was instrumental in the collaboration between the University of Oklahoma, T. Boon Pickens and the Masonic Charity Foundation in endowing a chair in Masonic Studies at OSU.

Ill. Brother Tresner is also a recipient of the Grand Cross of the Court of Honor which is the highest award that can be presented to a member of the Scottish Rite. He has a PhD. in Communications, has written many books on Freemasonry, is Orator of the Grand Lodge of Oklahoma, editor of the State publication and is Director of the Work at Guthrie Scottish Rite Valley. Dr. Tresner somehow also finds time to write the book review column in the Scottish Rite Bulletin.

Together these two brothers have written a very interesting book which is titled *A SHARED EXPERIENCE: FREEMASONRY AND THE NATIVE AMERICAN TRADITION*.

They will be present at our Stated Meeting on June 3rd and then on Saturday, June 4th will share their insight into writing and researching Masonic related subjects.
