





Vram Martirosyan, 32° Commander possible, such as "The Spirit of Hiram" and social activities such as the Santa Anita Racetrack outing. Tell them about our language center, the museum and the library. For those who are seriously interested in Masonic scholarship, tell them about our symbolism class and soon to be launched Master Craftsman study group.

We all get objections. How do we react to them? One big objection is the time to take the degrees. The degrees basically are delivered in an intensive manner to have the proper impact on the candidate, and spreading them over 3-4 weekends would result in a more diluted experience, as well as the difficulty for cast and candidate alike in scheduling. I also state that there is no memorization or proficiency to pass with the Scottish Rite degrees. In blue lodge, it could be months or even years between degrees. In Scottish Rite, it is just two weeks and you're done.

We also get the 'I will do it later' answer. My response is 'How much later? and that I have kicked the can down the road on various things, including Masonic activities. Once I have joined them, I have said to myself, "This is great, I could kick myself for not joining sooner." Of course, there are legitimate career and family issues which must be respected, and you will have to gauge how to follow-up, based upon your information from and relationship with the candidate. I recently saw the Grand Master of Nevada as a candidate in a York Rite ceremony. He prioritized time for this during his year as GM and has set an example for us - "This is doable - don't procrastinate."

I explain that we took obligations in our blue lodges to seek further light in Masonry. The Scottish Rite is one avenue to pursue that light and fulfill that obligation. We have a beautiful series of memorable, soul-searching and thought-provoking degrees which every Mason should experience.

We have a fine cast, fabulous sets, props, backdrops, and costumes. We have a unique bond of brotherhood at PSR in which men are willing to regularly drive from Long Beach, Simi Valley, Thousand Oaks, Lancaster, Palmdale and even Arizona to experience.
