
Dear Ladies,

William married his wife Tara in 2007 and has a 23 year old son Vincent who also picked up the music bug as an accomplished guitarist. The last 10 of years their lives have been largely occupied with the restoration of Weatherwolde Castle in Tujunga, Ca. The 1928 structure came within inches of being bulldozed by a developer and when Malouf caught a glimpse of the Gothic structure, he set out to convince the developer to sell it instead. The highly publicized saving of the castle has brought much joy to the community, continues to be a labor of love for William and is now a registered Los Angeles Historic-Cultural Monument. He serves on the Sunland-Tujunga Neighborhood Council Land Use Committee and is a member of the Little Landers Historic Society.

Bro. Malouf was raised in Reseda Masonic Lodge No. 666 in 2002, served as their Master in 2008 and Officers Coach from 2009-2013. He was honored with the Hiram Award in 2013 and continues to be active as Chair of the Investment and Masonic Education committees. William joined Pasadena Valley Scottish Rite in fall of 2003, has been active in the degrees as an actor for 12 years and more recently as a Degree Master. He is a member of the Cathedral Board and is also a founding member of the Pasadena Saturday Morning Philosophical Discussion Group.

Scottish Rite Master Craftsman Course:

- MCIII: "Scottish Rite Philosophy" covers Albert Pike's *Morals and Dogma* (Annotated Ed. by Arturo De Hoyos) and Rex Hutchen's *A Bridge to Light* (4th ed.) to explore the moral and philosophical teachings of the 1° to 32° of Craft and Scottish Rite Freemasonry in a deeper level.
