# Pasadena Scottish Rite Bulletin The Secretary's Memo Pad Ill. William F. Rook, 33°

Greetings Brethren, ladies, and friends,

I wish first to congratulate our newly installed lodge officers and hope they have a successful year. I would also like to thank the VMAP and Ambassador teams for a successful 2018.

But moving ahead to this year and membership it has not been a good year. We presently have a membership of 822. We started the year 2018 with a membership of 872. During



the year we lost 33 men to the Celestial Lodge Above. We suspended 66 members for non-payment of dues and anther 10 who were suspended by the Grand Lodge. Six members affiliated with other valleys and left our valley, for a total loss of 115. On the other side, we initiated 44 new member and reinstated 11 and had 6 brothers affiliate with us, for a total of 61. Our growth was -115 members for 2018.

There is not a great deal we can do about death, and we can't do much about Grand Lodge Suspension. But 66 SNPD is not good. Our membership retention team as well as our Knights have been working in that area. And as you can see they got 11 to reup their membership. I have my reasons for these numbers, but others might see things differently. But it is something we need to work on turning around.

But by working together we can keep Pasadena Scottish Rite as a viable and strong part of the Masonic community.



# Charles J. Fisher, 32° KCCH Venerable Master, Lodge of Perfection

A Los Angeles native, Charles James Fisher, 32° KCCH, was raised in the Mt. Washington neighborhood of that city, attending Mt. Washington Elementary, Nightingale Junior High (now Middle School) and Franklin High School. He then attended East Los Angeles College and California State University at Los Angeles. He married Anne Marie Wozniak in 1980 and worked for 28 years with Transamerica Real Estate Tax Service.

He has worked the past 14 years as a free-lance historian, successfully nominating over 160 Historic Cultural Monument in the City of Los Angeles, as well as monuments in Ventura County and the cities of Glendale, Ojai and Sierra Madre. He is a board member and past President of the Highland Park Heritage Trust and presently serves on the board of the Highland Park Historic Preservation Overlay Zone for the City of Los Angeles. He has volunteered on several committees for the Los Angeles Conservancy.

His parents, Lloyd Bennington and Priscilla Fisher, both veterans of World War II, were active in the American Legion while he was growing up and, at the age of 10, he was Commander of the Alhambra Squadron of the Sons of the American Legion, later going on to be the 18th District Commander and to hold several offices in the Detachment of California of that body.

His Masonic career began in 1970, when he joined Highland Park Chapter, Order of DeMolay, becoming Master Councilor of that Chapter in 1974. He has received the honors of Representative DeMolay, Chevalier and the Cross

of Honor. He and his father joined Highland Park Lodge No. 382, where he was raised in 1976. In 1983, he served in the East at Fellowship Lodge No. 290, after Highland Park Lodge consolidated with Eastgate Lodge No. 290 in 1982. Fellowship consolidated with South Pasadena Lodge No 367 in 1992, and he went on again to be Worshipful Master there in 2003. He is presently serving as Chaplain at South Pasadena, were he has also served as Officers Coach. He also currently the Chaplain in the Southern California Research Lodge No. 1005 and the Junior Deacon in Archimedes Lodge UD.

He joined Pasadena Scottish Rite in the Spring Reunion of 1984 and went on to participate in the degrees. He was one of the original founders of the Pasadena Chapter of the Knights of Saint Andrew, serving as Knight Orator until receiving his red hat in 2009. He served as Wise Master of the Chapter of Rose Croix in 2006. He has been conducting the Saturday Discussion Group for the last three years and is a member of the Scottish Rite Research Society.

He is also a member of Al Malaikah Shrine, the Royal Order of Scotland, the Robert the Bruce Association and the York Rite Bodies in the San Gabriel Valley.

Outside of Masonry and history, his interests include collecting antiquarian books and classic cars, photography and travel.

Our 2018 VMAP (Valley Membership Achievement Project) Report was happily completed before the December deadline. The report requires the local signatures of the VMAP chairman, Venerable Master, Personal Representative, and General Secretary. The report is then sent to the S.G.I.G. or his Deputy. Our submission was approved and forwarded to the Supreme Council for final approval. There is no set date for receiving the final approval, but in the past, it is usually sometime in the



springtime. The Assistant Secretary also was involved in assembling our information.

Allow me to give you some background on the VMAP program.

The comprehensive Valley assessment tool covers 11 categories of activities - Member Retention/Engagement, Scottish Rite Education - Members, Member Recruitment, New Member Engagement, Reunion Experience, Scottish Rite Education-Candidates, Philanthropy, Public Image, Degree Conferral Proficiency, Valley Leadership & Management and Valley Organizations.

There are mandatory requirements within each category that every Valley must fulfill, then followed by a 'cafeteria style' choice of activities that the Valley must perform from the list to satisfy the category. There are also provisions for a Valley to include an activity which may not have been listed. The number of activities after the mandatory activities varies depending upon the size of the Valley. Our Valley is large, so we had to meet a larger requirement. We performed approximately 100 items across the 11 categories.
