His topic for this talk will be: "High Mindedness: The Fraternal, Funereal, and Religious Architecture of Los Angeles".

"Certain architectural forms are known for solemn and monumental expression, e.g., grand public mausolea, houses of worship, and the gathering places of mystery schools and fraternal orders. But Los Angeles, famously known for her extravagant architecture, often blends fantasy into the plaster. In a landscape of exuberant buildings, the magisterial often went the extra mile to express themselves as unusual, exotic, and at times esoteric."

As a fellow historian, I find Brother Marsak's presentations to be both fun and educational, so be sure to get your reservation's in for our dinner on June 7th.

A reminder the cast and crew for "The Living Constitution" that our rehearsal will be starting in June. We will be performing again in September at the Rite, as well as two lodges that have requested to see it. Question to ponder about the Fourth Degree:

The concept of progress is an important ideal of the Scottish Rite. What are some of the ways in which the themes and lessons of this degree reflect and expand upon the notion of progress?

For the June Stated meeting some study of a Bridge to Light and Morals and Dogma can assist in answering the above question. We will at our June Stated meeting take a portion of time for Scottish Rite Education and have a



short presentation on the 4th Degree and a discussion period.

Now let's discuss the structure of Pasadena Scottish Rite. There are 4 distinct business model in play here. First there is the Pasadena Lodge of Perfection, the business face of the four bodies. Check payable to them should be "Pasadena Scottish Rite", a 501(c) (10) organization.

Secondly there is the Scottish Rite Cathedral Association of Pasadena, the building management group a 501 (c) (2) organization. Check made out to them should be addressed "Pasadena Scottish Rite Cathedral Association.

As part of the Scottish Rite Cathedral Association they have a sub organization with a dba as "Pasadena Scottish Rite Events Center" They are responsible for managing the rental of the building for special outside events and filming location. Their checks should be written as named.

And lastly, we work closely with The California Scottish Rite Foundation, a 501 (c) (3) philanthropy. They are the funding source for the Rite Care Pasadena Childhood Speech and Language Center. Being a charitable non-profit, and tax-deductible entity, it is important to properly assign the check for Tax purposes. All check directed to the Language Center need to be completed as follows:


