We do not partake in political or religious discussions while in Lodge. We are the face of Masonry and to the world outside, what we do reflects upon our fraternity. I suspect the Grand Master or the Grand Commander would frown upon or worse if they saw what I have seen from our members. Masonry should not be seen as increasing the divisiveness in our Country. Discussion and debate are the foundation of our Republic, but the bucolic entries do not add to the discussion and only add to the inability to compromise. There is also a movement that I see occurring in our Valley that is an outgrowth of divisiveness that is growing in several of our local Blue Lodges. I see evidence of the sides and reasons or the bitterness that is being expressed in those Lodges being promulgated here in our Valley, with different sides being formed and the resulting ill feelings are being expressed to me. Our Valley is well thought of and is an excellent example of Scottish Rite Masonry. I will not have our reputation put asunder by biased and personal grievances that will destroy our Valley as it is doing
