In 1919 the Executive Secretary of the Valley of Kansas City in the Orient of Missouri took nine young men under his wings who wanted to form a baseball team. The also showed an interest in what Scottish Rite Masonry was. They were explained the purposes of the Scottish Rite and some of the men revered by Scottish Rite Masons. One of those revered personages was the Last Grand Master of the Knight Templar, Jacque DeMolay. From the stories they heard they formed what is now known as the Order of DeMolay. The Exec-



utive Secretary was Ill. Frank Land who became more famous as Dad Land. For 40 years Dad Land was the guiding influence of DeMolay. On November 8, 1959, Frank Land passed away, but his legacy lived on. It is now the Centennial of the Order of DeMolay.

One of the honors that is presented to a DeMolay is that of being Knighted a Chevalier. A Chevalier is equivalent to the Scottish Rite Knight Commander Court of Honor. Knights Chevalier gather annually to break bread with each other on the date of the death of Frank Land. This year our Stated Meeting is on November 8 because of Reunion. Therefore, to honor Frank Land and DeMolay every Senior DeMolay or DeMolay who is a Chevalier and wears their Chevalier cords to the Stated Meeting will receive a free dinner.

Also, at our November meeting we will be welcoming our newest Masters of the Royal Secret. Congrats to all those who completed the classes and who will receive their cap and ring on November 8th. Besides our new Masters of the Royal Secret will be honoring some of those that are who are veteran members as at dinner we will recognize and honor our

The Scottish Rite Mason who signs the petition has a responsibility that does not end with their signature on the petition. If you invited a guest to a gathering at your home, you make sure that he meets all of your guest and is made welcome and comfortable. Isn't the man whom you recommend Scottish Rite Freemasonry entitled to the same courtesy? As his sponsor, is it not your duty to assist him with his work and take an interest in his progress? It seems to us that it is, and that you should see to it that he fully understands the fine lessons of our degrees. If you recommend a man to the Scottish Rite, satisfy yourself that he is receiving that for which you recommended him. To do so is but a Masonic courtesy and it is your duty as a Scottish Rite Mason.
