Meet the Venerable Master



Gregory J. Gabriel, 32° KCCH Venerable Master, Lodge of Perfection

Worshipful Brother Gabriel was born at Shaw Air Force Base, Sumter, South Carolina in 1956 and has lived all but those first six months in sunny Southern California. He went to school in Pasadena and Arcadia, where he participated in track and field along with marching and concert bands, graduating from Arcadia High School in 1974. He later earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Recreation Administration from Cal Poly, Pomona in 1979.

Having worked several jobs to make money for his studies, Greg settled for a career in law enforcement. Retiring from the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department after over thirty years of active service, he is currently a reserve Deputy assigned to the Altadena Sheriff's Station. He is a member of the California Reserve Peace Officers Association and President of the Armenian Peace Officers Association. He has been awarded with several County citations for his work including the Department's Distinguished Service Award, Exemplary Service Award, the Sheriff's Meritorious Award, and the Unit Commander's Citation Award.

A member of Saint Gregory Armenian Apostolic Church in Pasadena, he is named after the church's namesake.

Greg began his masonic career with Arcadia Chapter, Order of DeMolay. He is a Past Master Councilor, Past Citrus League President and has been honored with the Past Master Councilor-Meritorious Service Award, Blue Honor Key, Chevalier, Cross of Honor and the Active Legion of Honor. He is also a Deputy Member of the International Supreme Council. As an adult, he has served a chapter, league and jurisdiction "Dad" and district governor.

After being raised a Master Mason in 1977, Greg served as Master of Pasadena Lodge #272 in 1983 and 1992. He has been the Officer's Coach and served on the temple board for over 15 years. He served the Grand Lodge of California as an Inspector from 2001 to 2009 and again as an Inspector-At-Large from 2016 to present. He was presented with the Hiram Award in 1993 and is a third generation mason of Pasadena Lodge. He is a charter member and first inspector of Ararat Lodge #848. He is a life member of the Southern California Past Master's Association. Greg also joined Sa Gabriel Valley Chapter No. 100 where served as High Priest in 2000, 2012 and 2013. A member of Rosemead Council No.25 of Cryptic Masons serving as Illustrious Master in 2013 and 2014. And is a member of Foothill Commandery No.63 where he will serve as Commander in 2021. He was honored with the Royal Arch Meritorious Service Award in 2014.

After joining Pasadena Scottish Rite in 1984, he has had a part in the 14th and 27th degrees. He has acted in the Spirit of Hiram for 10 years as a fellowcraft, King Solomon and Jubalum. He was Wise Master of the Chapter of Rose Croix in 2015, and currently Almoner for all bodies and assistant to the Personal Representative. He serves on the Childhood Language Center board and the Cathedral Association. He received the Knight Commander of the Court of Honor in 2017.

Greg is a member of Al Malaikah Shrine and President of the Marksman Shrine Club in 2019. A member of the Sciots, The Royal Order of Scotland, The Robert the Bruce Association and Clan Stirling Bridge. He is also a member of Allied Masonic Degrees, the York Rite Sovereign College and the Red Cross of Constantine.

In his spare time, Greg sits as a Director on the Verdugo Athletic Foundation and the Youth Fund of Southern California. He is a float operator for Phoenix Decorating Company and has operated the Shrine Hospitals float in the Rose Parade for the last 9 years. He is an on-line ordained minister and has officiated three weddings and a non-masonic funeral. He also likes to cook, combat shoot, ride motorcycles and travel the world.


