

As a youth Bob was an active member of DeMolay and served as Master Councilor of San Gabriel Chapter Order of DeMolay in 1976, he joined Pasadena Lodge No.272 and received his third degree on November 15, 1982. His first line signer on his applications for DeMolay and Pasadena Lodge was Hon. Gregory J. Gabriel 32° KCCH.

Bob enlisted in the US Army on December 7, 1982 and started his Army career in the Old Guard of the Infantry where he was a horse soldier and fired salute guns until he transferred to the Signal Corps in 1987 and was stationed in Fort Polk, LA and Darmstadt, Germany before retiring from the US Army with the rank of E-5p Sergeant in August of 1994. While in Germany Bob was also officiating High School Football and Basketball games and continued to do so for several years after leaving the Army.

Bob is a Past High Priest of San Gabriel Valley Chapter Royal Arch Masons No.100. He is also an active member and officer of Alhambra Council No.25 Cryptic Masons, Foothill Commandery No.63 Knights Templar, Long Beach Pyramid No.43 Ancient Egyptian Order of Sciots & Archimedes Lodge No.871. Greetings, Brethren....

I hope everyone is healthy and looking forward to the easing of the COVID 19 'Stay Home / Stay in Place' directives. The purpose of this article is to keep you informed and updated on our Valley's financial and investment fronts. You might note some additional financial information is provided in this month's bulletin...namely, checking account balances for the Lodge of Perfection,



Cathedral Association and Almoner's Fund; in addition to two April and one investment account for March balances. The 'goal' for these balances is to provide them for the preceding month's amounts. To try and have them 'current' runs into timing issues with obtaining our bank and investment account statements and getting them into the Bulletin, with its publication lead time. So, if we can agree to a month's 'lag', that's what we'll do!

As this article is written on May 27th, the market as measured by the Dow Jones Industrial Average (DJIA), closed today at 25,548. My last article was written on or about April 11th, where the DJIA was 23,719...an approximate month and a half gain of 1,829 points; or approximately 7.71%. Again, keeping things in perspective, with a market 'low' this year of 18,592... today's close puts us to the level around March 9th ... some two weeks into the dramatic market slide.

Are we out of the woods yet? No one knows for certain. 1st Quarter earnings while down (and rightfully expected) were taken in stride. There are signs of life with some improved business openings and growth in advance of the 2nd Quarter, to end June 30. Unemployment remains an issue with 1 in every 5 people out of work. This is expected to continually reduce over the Summer and be much improved by the end of the year. Major industries affected continue to be dining out, entertainment (including sports), hotel, airlines, and related travel.
