


Well with that said I will see you in September I hope!

Treasurer's Report

Greetings, Brethren....

As I write this article, it is the 1st of July. In 'normal times', we would be engaged in all things Summer. Without stating the obvious, this year is certainly different!... And, please keep in mind that this article written in July is for the August Bulletin; and things can certainly change between now and then!



Yesterday, the market put the 2nd Quarter of 2020 into the books. The market closed yesterday at 25,813; with a 'gain' from the end of the 1st Quarter March 31st at 21,917...some 3,896 points. You know how I like to put things into context, so if we look at the 2nd Quarter Dow Jones close and compare it against our benchmark of December 31, 2019; or the beginning of the year, the Dow was at 28,538, and we are approximately 2,725 points from the beginning of the year. If you'll allow me to 'round the numbers', the change from the 1st to 2nd Quarter was a gain of almost a half of its decline. From the end of June to the beginning of this year, we are again 'almost' half of where we started. To shamelessly take a line Bon Jovi's "Livin' on a Prayer'; 'we're almost there'. But, as noted at the outset of this article, things can change between now and next quarter and December.

Without making a political statement, COVID-19 continues to spread, unemployment saw a very nice decrease as some establishments and businesses opened and brought people back to work. It is still a 'fragile' time. Debates continue regarding continue opening the economy up with the speed it is being done, throttling it back to slow the spread of COVID-19; or worst case...close again.

Our Investment Committee meets on July 22nd with our Investment Manager. I will include a summary of that meeting, our discussions, and any decisions in the August Bulletin.
