Brethren,

Here we are, six months into our year and the state and Masonry is now reopening. Our July Stated Meeting will be a hybrid meeting of both an in-person and a ZOOM meeting. While the guidance of the governor, the Grand Master has loosened the meeting requirements, the Pasadena Public Health Department, which we must follow, still requires proof of vaccination or a negative COVID-19 test within 72 hours of the meeting. These will be required before being



admitted into the building. There will be a dinner before the Stated Meeting and you will need to call the office, Mary, for a reservation. No reservation means no dinner. No walk ins. There will be open seating for the dinner and subsequent meeting. To attend the meeting via ZOOM you will need to register as we have done for the last few months. Our SGIG will be in attendance for the dinner and meeting.

As we look forward to celebrating the 4th of July, I read about our country today and it is different from twenty years ago. I find that the tenets of Masonry are missing in large part in our society. Thirty-one of the fifty-six signers of the Declaration of Independence were Masons. Twenty-three of the thirty-nine signers of the Constitution were Masons. During the Revolutionary War there at least 49 generals and many Naval officers who were Masons. Between 1789 and 1940 thirty-three Justices on the Supreme Court were Masons. Six Chief Justices were Masons. There have been sixteen Presidents that were Masons. Our nation was guided by men who believed in the tenets of our Fraternity. When I look at our flag with my hand over my heart and I repeat "I pledge allegiance...." I remember saluting in uniform and I still get that proud feeling of belonging to a great nation and willing to provide service as needed for its survival.

John H. As we reopen the following protocols will be followed:

- You must make a reservation for the dinner and/or the Stated 1. Meeting. No one without a reservation will be admitted. Dinner tickets will be downstairs.
- Participants must show proof of vaccination or the results of a 2. negative Covid 19 test at the most 72 hours before event.
- Participants fully vaccinated do not need to wear a mask, 3. those not fully vaccinated must wear mask except when eating. (Protocol of PPHD)
- Participants will be issued wrist bands: 4.

Purple: fully vaccinated Green: not vaccinated

Dinner seats will be assigned by Mary. The only entrance into the building will be the glass doors in the north parking. The elevator will be locked in the parking lot and will be an exit only" device. Elevator Service inside the building will be normal. At 7:30PM there will be a guard posted at the glass doors. So, plan on arriving before 7:30PM.

Mysteries of the Rose-Croix: Historic Origins & Symbolic Meaning of the 18th°

The Knight of the Rose-Croix Degree within the AASR of Freemasonry (18th Degree) was largely developed by John Baptiste Willermonz in the 18th century. This degree was meant to emphasize the value of the Heavenly virtues, while also alluding to alchemical, hermetic, and astrological ideas. The candidate in this degree goes on a quest, which is reminiscent of the Quest of the Holy Grail, and this was by design. In this presentation, we will examine the symbolism, origins, and myths that were incorporated into the degree, and examine how these ideas have relevance to us in our modern world. We will also discuss how the degree is presented differently in different parts of the world, and what the requirements are for a Mason to receive the degree in different territories. Did you know that in the middle ages, an alchemical vessel was called " a pelican", and it was represented by the symbol of a pelican- as can be found on the 18th degree apron? Ideas such as this, and others, will be explained and shown, and the lessons on how to "heal the wasteland" from the Grail myths will be elucidated, as they relate to the degree and Freemasonry as a whole.
