

JEFFERY M. WILKINS Grand Master of Masons in California

Brother Jeffery Michael Wilkins was raised a Master Mason on August 27, 1992 in Lafayette Lodge No. 16 under the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Kansas. He served as Master of that lodge in 1995 while stationed at Fort Riley with the United States Army.

When Jeff was transferred to Panama, he affiliated with Gatun

Lodge of the District Grand Lodge of Panama under the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts. Jeff served the District Grand Lodge as Grand Pursuivant in 1997 and Senior Grand Warden in 1998.

While in the Army, Jeff commanded the 911th Maintenance Company in Panama and the Recruiting Company in Yakima, Washington. After 10 years of service, he left the Army with the rank of Captain.

He then pursued a career in the semiconductor industry, applying his degree in mechanical engineering from Rochester Institute of Technology. He spent nineteen years working in the quality field from Quality Engineer to the Vice President of Global Quality. In 2019, Jeff joined Collins Aerospace where he is the site Quality Leader for the Propulsion Quality organization in Fairfield, CA.

After moving to the Bay Area, Jeff affiliated with Mosaic Lodge No. 218 in Livermore. He served as Master in 2008. In 2015, Mosaic Lodge presented him the Hiram Award. He is also a member of the Columbia Historic Lodge U.D. and the Northern California Research Lodge, serving as Master in 2019. For the last eleven years, Brother Wilkins has been active with the Grand Lodge of California. He served as Junior Grand Deacon for Most Worshipful Larry L. Adamson in 2008-2009. He served three terms each as an Inspector and Assistant Grand Lecturer. Jeff served on the Ritual Committee, the Lodge Support Committee, and he was a facilitator for the leadership retreats. Jeff has been a director of the five Constitutional Boards and also served as president of the Nob Hill Masonic Center for five years.

Jeff is a 32° Scottish Rite Mason, Knight Commander of the Court of Honor in the Valley of Oakland. He is a member of the York Rite Bodies in Union City, Atlas Chapter UD RAM in San Francisco, Aahmes Shriners, Semper Fidelis Chapter No. 135 Order of the Eastern Star, the National Sojourners, and Saint Francis Conclave, Knights of the Red Cross of Constantine. For four years, Jeff served on the Advisory Board of Livermore Assembly No. 246, International Order of Rainbow for Girls.

Jeff and his wife, Liz, reside in Sonoma. They have two adult children, Grace and March.

As we reopen the following protocols will be followed:

JULY 2021, MARKS THE 20TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FOUND-ING OF THE KNIGHTS OF SAINT ANDREW OF PASADENA SCOTTISH RITE.

July 16, 2021, was the twentieth anniversary of the creation of The Knights of Saint Andrew of Pasadena Scottish Rite, or KSA.

Who are the Knights of Saint Andrew? The Knights of Saint Andrew, or KSA, is a group of Masters of the Royal Secret (32°) dedicated to serving the Valleys of Scottish Rite at large. The KSA provides critical support to all of the committees of the



Valley, assists at events when needed, and promotes active membership in the Valley.

The Knights of Saint Andrew members also work on a regular basis in the Costume Room, Make Up, Supernumerary, Backstage, Props and Electrical, Credentials/Registration, Service Knights, Kitchen.

How did the Knights of Saint Andrew start?

The modern KSA has become a group that exists throughout many Valleys of Scottish Rite nationwide. It started in the Valley of Guthrie Oklahoma, and was meant to provide a social and service setting for the newest Scottish Rite Mason.

In early 1993 the late, Ill. Weldon Good, 33rd of the Tulsa Valley in Oklahoma saw a need for assistance during reunions. He also noticed that Masons were joining the Scottish Rite but not returning to help and participate in subsequent reunions. To rectify this he de-

veloped the organization now known as the Knights of Saint Andrew as a service group for the valley.

Finding that the Knights of Saint Andrew worked so well in the Tulsa Valley, Brother Good offered, with the approval of the SGIG, to Charter KSA Chapters in the Valleys of Guthrie and McAlester. That was done in October 1993 and early 1994 respectively. The Guthrie Knights assist with the Grand Opening of each reunion. Attired in kilts and Glenn Gharries, accompanied by pipers, they carry and post the banners of each Lodge, the Scottish Rite Banner and the ceremonial swords.

But the origins of the Order date back to the period of 1220-1232 AD, when a Confraternity was established in the City of Acre, of the then Crusader Latin Kingdom of Jerusalem (occupying the same territory as the modern state of Israel) to protect pilgrims and merchants. This Confraternity, consisting of burgesses and knights of largely French heritage, met in the City's Castle and chose the Holy Apostle, St. Andrew, as their Patron. They constituted themselves as a Crusading Order of Knights with the object of resisting tyranny and protecting public safety.

Currently, in the Southern Masonic Jurisdiction there are 152 Valleys with Knights of Saint Andrew Chapters. In the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction, there are 28 Chapters. From the small beginnings of three Chapters in Oklahoma, the Knights of Saint Andrew grown across both, the Southern Jurisdiction & Northern Jurisdiction, and from coast to coast.
