UPDATED COVID 19 MASK REQUIREMENT

Proof of full vaccination required (2 Pfizer or 2 Moderna, or 1 Johnson & Johnson) Fully vaccinated persons will not be required to wear a mask while attending a Scottish Rite function, BUT IT IS HIGHLY RECOMMENDED THAT THEY DO.

Non vaccinated persons must show proof of negative covid test (PCL administered no later than 2 days before, Antigen administered 1 day before) Such persons shall be required to wear a mask at all times while at a Scottish Rite event, except when eating.

Herair Avadis Rostamian also known as Harry Rostamian, was born in Tehra, Iran. After attending the Sandoukht elementary school, and graduating from Tehran Business High School, he then worked as import export administrator for his dad's company.

He left Tehran, after Khomani's regime came to power (he has stories to tell you) and settled in London for the next three years studying Accounting, Economics, and Statistics with the hopes of obtaining a degree in Business and Economics. Due to unforeseen difficulties, he changed direction and completed a certificate program in Hotel Management and Business studies, additionally he began working in a small hotel and thereafter in a restaurant starting as a busboy and promoting up to Head Chef in a restaurant chain called "The Great American Disaster" a Texan style steak and hamburger place, (he has stories to tell if you ask).

After many attempts, he was able to obtain a visitor's visa (he also has interesting stories on this too) and arrived in Los Angeles in 1982. He lived with his brother's family for few months and thereafter he lived on his own.

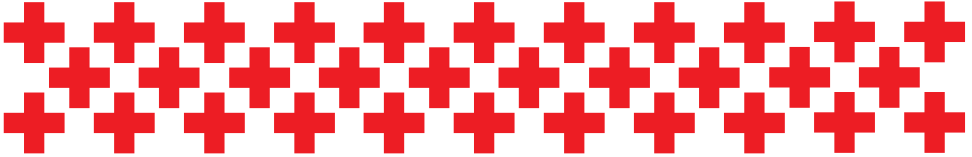

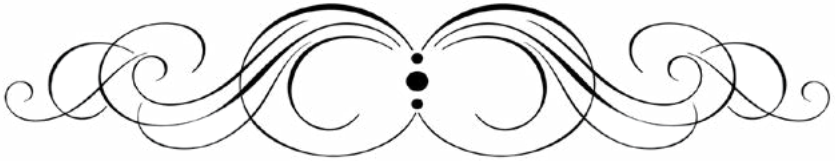
