Knights of Saint Andrew Tim O'Hair, 32° KSA

We find ourselves in November, the month of that great American feast known at Thanksgiving. But that's not all – here in Pasadena, it's the month of the Knights' Feast organized by the Knights of St. Andrew – whose name, in turn, references the apostle Andrew, whose "feast day" is November 30. The legends of Thanksgiving are well known. But St. Andrew? Do you know much about him, or his story, his connections through history?

Andrew holds a very central role in Christianity – he was the (younger) brother of Peter, and a disciple of John the Baptist, who guided them and John the Evangelist to follow Christ. He thus became one of the twelve Apostles.

Like the others, he ventured forth from the Holy Land to evangelize, and his travels took him throughout the region of the Black Sea and modern day Eastern Europe, leading to a key role in the Eastern Orthodox Church – and a position as patron saint of numerous countries, including Romania, Ukraine, and Russia. Ultimately, Andrew was martyred for his evangelizing at Patras, in Greece, circa 60-70 CE. The legend holds further that, in his profound humility, he felt himself unworthy of being crucified on a cross, like Christ; and instead was executed on an x-shaped cross (known as a crux decussata, or "saltire"), bound hand and foot – the "X" is thus strongly associated with Andrew. The day of his martyrdom is held as November 30.

Our narrative continues in Scotland, which adopted the saltire as part of their flag (the white cross on the blue sky). One version holds that descendants of Scythian converts ventured from the Black Sea to settle in Scotland. But look closely at another, for some additional clues which link these symbols to the fraternity, which has its own roots in Scotland. The Scottish history holds that in the 9th century, a certain Angus (aka Oengus), King of the Picts, faced overwhelming odds on the battlefield against a Saxon force led by Athelstan – he prayed fiercely to St. Andrew, whose relics and remains may have been installed (at St. Andrews, well known today for its University and golf). The King and his army had a vision of a white cross against the

blue sky, and declared should they emerge victorious, they would name a day in Andrew's honor. Well, they did win (the battle, anyway, for the quarrels between the forces on the British islands would continue for centuries – and both William "Braveheart" Wallace and King Robert the Bruce would both appeal to St. Andrew for guidance!), and the day was set, as was the saltire on the flag.

But the tradition of a celebration on November 30? Well, that takes us to another familiar place, Charleston, South Carolina, in the early 18th century, where Scottish immigrants formed a St. Andrew's Society – the oldest Scots society of its type in the world, dedicated to helping widows and orphans in the area. This group set the date as a "feast day" and spread the word.

Perhaps you are a bit more curious as you read about the places, names, and symbols woven throughout the tales - perhaps you have read or watched the degree named Knight of St. Andrew, or participated in other KSA events... so you are thus implored to "hear what you shall hear, and see what you shall see," as you raise your fraternal glass to St. Andrew this season.



Library Treasures, continued...

THE CITY OF PASADENA lies in the foothills of the San Gabriel Mountains, overlooking the San Gabriel Valley. Behind it, to the north, are Altadena and the pine-clad heights of Mount Wilson and Mount Lowe. Its southern limits are separated from Los Angeles by South Pasadena and Alhambra.

The city was originally a part of Rancho Pasqual, a Mexican land grant, and was purchased for \$25,000 by the "California Colony of Indiana". This group was composed of wealthy men from the east and middle west. The settlement was called "Indiana Colony", but in 1875 it was changed to Pasadena, an Indian name probably meaning "Crown of the Valley".

On October 15, 1883, a Dispensation was granted to Pasadena Lodge No. 272, and on October 16, 1884, a charter was granted. The town grew and became a permanent community, incorporated in 1886 and chartered by the state in 1901. Pasadena actively supported its educational institutions. In 1891 the California Institute of Technology was founded and Mount Wilson Observatory was established in 1904. The city gradually became a recognized center of education.

At the close of the nineteenth century, a group of Scottish Rite Masons, some of whom were members of Pasadena Lodge No. 272, petitioned for a Scottish Rite Lodge of Perfection in Pasadena. On December 11, 1895, William Frank Pierce, 33°, Sovereign Grand Inspector General for California, duly constituted Temple Lodge of Perfection No. 7 and installed the following officers: Florin L. Jones, 33°, Venerable Master; Arthur H. Conger, 32°, Senior Warden; Charles J. Willett, 32°, Junior Warden; Wyllys Hall, 18°, Orator; La Fayette S. Porter, 32°, Almoner; Ernest H. May, 14°, Secretary; William T. Clapp, 32°, Treasurer; Oscar O. Freeman, 32°, Master of Ceremonies; Edward E. Gaylord, 30°, Senior Expert; Robert E.

Montgomery, 32°, Junior Expert; Arthur M. Clifford, 32°, Captain of Guard; and Neils L. Thompson, 14°, Tyler.
