

Master of Kadosh, continued....

As most of you know, Albert Pike (1809-1891), who served as the Sovereign Grand Commander of the Supreme Council, Scottish Rite (Southern Jurisdiction, USA) from 1859 to 1891, was very instrumental in developing and expanding our Scottish Rite doctrines, rituals and procedures. In his famous book, "Morals and Dogma of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry," published in 1871, Pike primarily focused on the meanings and effects of the Scottish Degrees and their beautiful and impressive Ritual. He had an optimistic and positive opinion about the Scottish Rite, viewing it as a means of further promoting the principles of Freemasonry and guiding its members on a path of moral, intellectual, and spiritual enlightenment. In Albert Pike's view, the Scottish Rite is an effective vehicle for emphasizing the importance of education, virtue, and service; he believes that the Scottish Rite plays a crucial role in instilling these values in its members. Pike as well as several other Masonic scholars are of the firm opinion that the Scottish Rite offers an invaluable opportunity for Masons to explore further and delve deeper into the historical, philosophical and esoteric aspects of our Craft. The degrees of the Scottish Rite are means of imparting moral, ethical, and spiritual lessons to its members, guiding them on a journey of self-discovery and enlightenment.

Thus, going through the Scottish Rite Degrees is an essential step required for each Freemason who wants to develop his knowledge and educate himself in the history and esoterism imbedded in various parts of our ceremonies. It can be said with certainty that the Scottish Rite experience is required for one to get a better understanding of the true meaning of the first three Degrees of our Blue Lodges, especially the Third Degree.

As members of the Scottish Rite, therefore, it is our responsibility to educate and inform our Blue Lodges Brothers about the importance of the Scottish Rite teachings and experience. I truly believe it is our duty to promote the Scottish Rite specially to those Masons who are more interested in our history and in symbolic and esoteric meaning behind our Degrees. Let us reflect and contemplate on this duty and do all we can to promote the Scottish Rite.

Brother Narbeh was born into a Christian Armenian family in Teheran, Iran. After high school, he attended medical school. He and his wife moved to California in 1991, and after receiving accreditation for his medical degree, Narbeh attended law school. For the last 18 years, he is an attorney with the County of Los Angeles representing physicians who work at various County hospitals and clinics. For almost 20 years, Brother Narbeh has also been teaching medical as well as legal courses in various colleges and universities.

Brother Narbeh's Masonic life began in 1993. He was raised in July 1993 in Glendale Lodge. Later in the same year, he received his 32nd Degree at the Pasadena Scottish Rite. Narbeh served as the Master of Glendale Lodge in 1997, 1998 and 2007. In 2000, Brother Narbeh received the Hiram Award. He is also a member of Round Table Lodge No. 876, Ararat Lodge No. 848, La France Lodge No. 885, the Lodge of Holy Land No. 50 in Jerusalem, Israel, and Harmony Lodge No. 8 in Yerevan, Armenia.

In 2007, Brother Narbeh affiliated with the Grand Lodge of Iran in Exile or GLI. He is a Past Master of Hafez Lodge No. 8 and Toos Lodge No. 35 under the GLI. He served the GLI as the Grand Organist, Assistant Grand Lecturer, and the Grand Lecturer. During his term as the GLI Grand Lecturer, he published GLI's very first ritual book and floor work manual.

Brother Narbeh has served the Grand Lodge of California as the Grand Bible Bearer for two terms. He is currently the Grand Orator of the Grand

Lodge of California. He is a director on the Acacia Creek Board, and is the Inspector of the 737 Masonic District.

Brother Narbeh has a real passion for music. He has published two music collections and is working on his third. His second music collection, published in August 2020, is "Freemasons' Music," a book that has more than 400 pieces of Masonic music.


Of course, there are the regular activities the Scottish Rite has to offer, monthly dinner, stated meeting and the like, but there is so much more!

The Significance of Masonic Symbolism Our library has a wealth of material and literature on Freemasonry. Many subjects are available for study and research. I hope each month to focus in on some topics that might spark an interest in further study and research in the individual brother. This month symbolism is the topic.



Masonry is "veiled in allegory and illustrated

by symbols" because these are the surest ways by which moral and ethical truths may be taught. It is not only with the brain and the mind the the initiate takes in Masonry but also with the heart.

Mind speaks to mind with spoken and written words, Heart speaks to heart with words that can not be written or spoken. Those words are symbol; words which mean little to the indifferent, much to the understanding.

The body has its five senses through which the mind can learn; the mind also has imagination. That imagination may see farther than the eyes abd hear sounds farther then may be caught by the ears. To the imagination symbols become plain as printed words to the eyes, Nothing else will do; no words can be as effective.

Each Mason can and should analyze for himself each symbol, each allegory, and form his own personal moral philosophy. Through the study of symbolism he will learn the meaning of Masonry, and his own life will be enriched thereby.

The significance of symbolism is emphasized in the following quotation from Oliver Day Street's Symbolism of the Three Degrees.

It may be asserted in the broadest terms that the Mason that knows nothing of the symbolism knows little of Masonry. He may be able to repeat every line of ritual without error, and yet if he does noth understand the meaning of the ceremonies, the signs, the words, the emblems, and the figures, he is an ignoramous Masonically. It is distressing to witness how much timeand labor is spent in memorizing 'the work' and how little in ascertaining what it means, Far be if from me to underate the importance of letter operfection in rendering the ritual, In no other way can the symbolism of our emblems, traditions, and allegories be accurately preserved, but I do maintain that, if we never understand their meanings, it is useless to preserve them, The two go hand in hand; without either the beauty and symmetry of the masonic Temple is destroyed.

Take from Masonry its symbols and but the husk remains, the kernal is gone. He who hears but the words of Masonry misses their meaning entirely.



Summary:

Masonry reduces to practice the great principles of God's inherent love, charity, morality and kindness. But many times the symbols and the ceremonies deliberately have multiple meanings. The truth then is concealed in hints and allusions that are designed for discovery only in stages and through organized and systematic reflection and study. It is futile to advance unless we learn the lessons already given in work and ceremonies and communications and the related jurisprudence. Thus, we proceed toward our ultimate goal of Perfection, the name of our first fourteen degrees. But the Scottish Rite is practical. The world itself is God's handiwork and hence essentially good. In truth, it is the beginning of heaven and part of immortality. We should weigh the world's evil against the good; the misanthropy, the melancholy and the despair as opposed to the contentment, the blessings and the happiness. Compare our afflictions with those of they who are less fortunate. Our faults are more truly reflected in the mirror of enemies than that of friends. We have high duties to perform and an inspiring destiny to fulfill upon this earth as a noble field of action.
