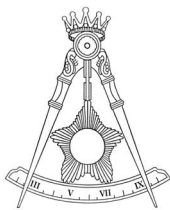

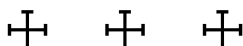

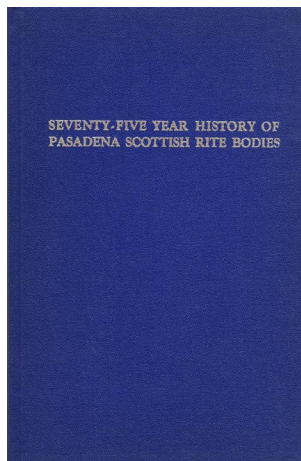

CHAPTER III
THE THIRD QUARTER CENTURY 1946 TO 1970

The year 1950 saw the Masonic play "The Spirit of Hiram" presented for the eighteenth consecutive year, the Easter drama "The Last Supper", in its full form, for the eighth consecutive year, the "St. John's Day Breakfasts" for the eleventh year, the "Annual Picnic" and the "Minstrel Show" each for the third time, and that ever-popular traveling Masonic play "Greater Love Hath No Man" in its twelfth year.

The year ended by the membership voting at the Stated Meeting on December 2, 1950, to change the Stated Meeting from Saturdays to Fridays to become effective on Friday, January 5, 1951. Thus, after meeting on Saturdays for fifty-five years, the last of the Saturday meetings was ended. The reason was that many business men, particularly in the small towns, were very busy on Saturdays and could not come to Lodge. The change, it was thought, would help them and also increase attendance at Stated Meetings. The membership now stood at 2659. This was a net gain of 953 in the five years since the "Golden Jubilee". This five year growth, alone, amounted to more than the total membership had been at the end

of the first thirty years. Quite an achievement.
